Russell Irwin, haematology and transfusion manager at Darlington, said, "The partnership with Northumbria Blood Bikes means we can provide better services for patients. We can replenish the Darlington blood bank through the night and at weekends and get blood that has special requirements on adefined system."

Owain Harris from Northumbria Blood Bikes added, "We donate our time and skills for free because we want to help save lives and improve patient care. We offer a dedicated service that we hope we can extend to other areas of the North East."

Graham Moor, Alan Ross and Mike Briant all donated their time, fuel & hotel expenses to represent us at the event (no money was taken out of our group funds to finance the visit)... and despite public attendance being lower than expected due to bad weather, we made many good contacts and gained plenty of insight into how other groups operate, and we will, over the next few months, attempt to incorporate some of the ideas ourselves. We also met up with Tim Peters, the Regional Operations Manager for BMW Authorities (he deals with all of the Police, Fire & Paramedic motorcycle teams around the country and, more importantly, knows when vehicles are being disposed of with full kit on them!) He's a valuable resource for retro-fit equipment and also mentioned that a smaller alternative to the 1200RT, the F800GT tourer, is now available for authority use with lights & livery etc.



Rob Wilks and Ian Hunter took part in the opening and closing parade of blood bikes, and we were also joined by Darth Vader, among others, who took time out to visit our stand for some publicity photos. As the day came to an end the weather resulted in many visitors and exhibitors getting stuck in the mud, and Owain ended up having to tow an air ambulance helicopter display out of the field....Rob was on hand to help jump start a Landrover, and all of us helped to push people out of the mud... so we now have a reputation for our group's willingness to assist! 
