Northumbria Blood Bikes are moving... into cars!

Don't worry, we are not abandoning the bikes or even changing our name... The cars will be used in the bad weather during the winter months when the temperature drops below 3 degrees (the cut off limit for carrying blood on the bikes). Two Nissan LEAFs and a Renault Kangoo are being provided courtesy of the Newcastle NHS Trust, and will allow us to continue to provide this life saving service regardless of the weather.

These are sample pics; when we have organized a photoshoot we will update you with the actual cars. The Nissan LEAF cars have the added bonus of being all electric, saving us a small fortune on petrol costs (Our average monthly spend on fuel is around £1000.00). The Renault Kangoo van has been donated to the charity and is ours to keep: After it's gone through servicing we intend to get it appropriately liveried and can use it for events, finally giving our publicity guru Owain Harris's car a well-deserved rest!



Many thanks to Newcastle NHS Foundation Trust for permitting us to use these vehicles, which means our service can continue in cold winter weather. Thanks also to Sean Storey, our NHS Liaison, and tho other volunteers whose tireless behind-the-scenes planning and negotiation assisted in obtaining this successful outcome.

Open Meeting at Northumbria University:



178 for County Durham & Darlington

243 for Gateshead, South Tyneside and Sunderland **265** for Northumbria

83 on relay with other blood bike groups

112 for Newcastle (in just two months!)

= 881 blood runs in less than a year!

Most of all, we have earned the trust, support and belief in us from the health trusts that we aim to serve. Thanks to all of you for making us what we are. Have a wonderful Christmas, and we hope to see you all in the New Year. Ride safe......
