The official handover of the new Vauxhall Mokka 4x4s to Northumbria & Cumbria Blood Bike Groups:



Former motorcycle racer and British champion James Whitham handed over the keys to the driver volunteers, as the northern ambassador for the Henry Surtees Foundation. Motor sport legend John Surtees set up the foundation after his son Henry died aged 18 in 2009.

Mr Whitham said of the blood cars: "It's clearly a good idea whichever way you look at it. I'm happy to be associated with it because I've been a bike racer and I'm also into mountain biking. It's not beyond the realms that one day I might need these guys and certainly I've used air ambulances coming away from circuits when I've hurt myself when I was racing. It resonates with me on quite a personal level." The blood bikes have been in action since January and now the cars will join them on the so-called 'BoB run' - blood on board run. The volunteer drivers take it in turns to transport blood in thermostatically controlled boxes, which the Henry Surtees Foundation has also donated.

The blood is taken by Northumbria Blood Bikes from the Royal Victoria Infirmary in Newcastle to a meeting point near Carlisle, where a relay is in place for the blood to continue its journey with Blood Bikes Cumbria. Northumbria then return to the RVI to take a second box to the other air base at Durham Tees Valley, every 24 hours, 365 days a year. If the blood is not used it is returned to the hospital and put back into the system. Laura Attwood, a doctor with the Great North Air Ambulance crew, said: "It's totally life changing for the patients we go and pick up on the roadside."

The keys were handed over to Bill Bertham, Chairman of Blood Bikes Cumbria, and Peter Robertson, Chairman of Northumbria Blood Bikes, at the Great North Air Ambulance airbase at Langwathby, near Penrith.

We also promised to get a plaque on it to show how it had been funded....and Here's Owain & Sue, proudly showing it off...




Waiting for the Kangoo....
